
The students attended the health camps conducted at Manerojuri on 1st November, Kavathevdk on 3rd November, Savlaj on 5th November, Manjare on 7th November, Visapur on 9th November, Khungav on 11th November, Vayphale on 13th November, Kumthe on 15th November, Borgav on 17th November, Ped on 19th November, Yelavi on 20th November, Sawai on 22nd November, and Turli on 23rd November 2025. They worked under the supervision of healthcare professionals throughout the scheduled activities.



During the camps, the students assisted in patient registration, vital sign assessment, blood pressure and temperature monitoring, and crowd management. They also supported doctors during clinical examinations and helped guide patients toward required treatment and follow-up procedures. Additionally, the students provided basic health education on hygiene, nutrition, and disease prevention.

Their contribution played a significant role in ensuring smooth execution of the health camps. The involvement of the students not only enhanced the efficiency of service delivery but also helped them gain valuable hands-on experience in community health nursing.

Through this initiative, they developed improved communication skills, clinical competency, and awareness of rural health challenges.


